

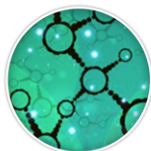
France-BioImaging Image Contest 2024

Terms & Conditions

Organizers	The France-BioImaging Image Contest 2024 is organized by the France-BioImaging infrastructure.
Deadline	The deadline for receipt of entries is Friday, November 8, 2024 (23h59, UTC+2).
Conditions of participation	Only French or foreign participants affiliated to a French institution can enter the contest. Foreign participants non-affiliated to a French institution can submit images and will be featured in the gallery, but will not be evaluated as part of the contest.
Type of entries accepted	Entries are to be submitted as digital images, to be uploaded via the dedicated contest form on the France-BioImaging website. Only individuals, direct owners of the images submitted, can submit entries. One person can submit a maximum of 3 entries. Images in high resolution are preferred (1000x1000 pixels and above). Max file size: 300 MB. File format: JPG, PNG.
Selection procedures	Once the deadline has passed, the entries submitted will be reviewed by a jury composed of members of the France-BioImaging Executive Board.
Prizes	The results of the contest will be sent to all participants by email and will be available online on the FBI website in December 2024. 1 to 3 images will be awarded (depending on the quantity and the quality of the submissions). Only 1 prize can be awarded per participant. France-BioImaging will cover the winners' registration fees for one 2025 microscopy related event of the laureates' choice. FBI will not cover the travel or accommodation costs to the event. FBI is not responsible for the preregistration or the acceptance of your participation to the event (organizers' prerogatives).
